

Trustees Flash October, 2023

It's October - Halloween, ghosts, trick or treat, and mysteries!

Keith Whitfield dug out a 6 ft x 8 ft x 4.5 ft hole around the mystery sink

hole in the back yard of the Victoria house. He filled it with dirt and planted grass on it. We found an old coke bottle and an old gear and a few roots. There were two iron ¾ in pipes which came up vertically and then went away from the house toward the fence. What was once there remains a mystery.

While trimming limbs and trees around the fence surrounding our property, John Waldrop unexpectedly discovered that one of the big oak trees at the driveway to the Victoria house had a very large limb that had a long deep crack through its middle. In the interest of precaution, we decided that the tree should go. The large sycamore tree on the front lawn by the sidewalk is dying and it will be removed soon.

There are many, many fluorescent light fixtures throughout our facilities. We must constantly replace them. To address this, we are developing a plan to change them out to LED fixtures. Our idea is to choose the same fixtures throughout the buildings so that we can keep one type of replacement on hand. Because there are so many, the project will be expensive. We will develop a phased-in approach. We will also address the sensor in the hallway of the FLC.

The fiber from the City is adequate, but the connectivity among the access points throughout the facilities needs attention. We are considering adding and/or replacing several of them. The Trustees continue to make plans to meet our obligations toward disaffiliation.

Great Day of Service 2023 was a great success! We had about 70 volunteers helping throughout the day! We packed 50 toiletry bags and made 10 no-sew blankets that will go to Street Love Ministries to be shared with those experiencing homelessness; we packed 25 Compassion Kits for our folks to take and keep in their cars and hand out to people in need; we planted flowers at Brookside; we packed food and loaded it into the cars of people who needed it at iServe; we collected several carloads of food (more than the pantry could hold!) for Warren Chapel's pantry; tended to some long overdue projects around the church property; sorted donations at Peace Place; wrote notes; prepped our children's activity bags; and more!
